About Webwise

Supporting the Digital Strategy for Schools, there is a wide range of training material available through the Webwise Internet Safety Programme to support teachers, students, and parents in addressing online safety. The Webwise Programme is an important educational support in this area. Functioning under the umbrella of the Oide Technology in Education division, Webwise is part of the new support service for teachers and school leaders, Oide. Funded by the Department of Education and the European Commission, webwise.ie promotes safer, better internet use through awareness-raising and education initiatives targeting teachers, children, young people, and parents.

Webwise develops and disseminates resources that help teachers integrate digital citizenship and online safety into teaching and learning in their schools. Webwise also provides information, advice, and tools to parents to support their engagement in their children's online lives. With the help of the Webwise Youth Advisory Panel, Webwise develops youth-oriented awareness raising resources and training programmes that promote digital citizenship and address topics such as online wellbeing, cyberbullying and more.

National and European Policy

The work of Webwise aligns to the pillar 3 of the Digital Strategy for Schools, supports the Cineáltas: Action Plan on Bullying and aligns to the 3 pillars of the European Better Internet for Kids+ Strategy;

1. A safe digital environment to protect children from harmful and illegal online content.
2. Empower children in the digital world and give them the necessary skills to make safe choices and express themselves online.
3. Improve children's active participation, with more child-led activities to foster innovative and creative digital experiences.

SUPPORTS FOR PARENTS

Research shows parents are the main source of help when something bothering or upsetting happens online to the children and parents are the primary educators of their children. As children are spending an increasing amount of time online at home it is vital to educate and support parents around this in order to reinforce appropriate behaviour online. Webwise Parents Hub

The [Webwise Parents Hub](#) provides guidance and practical information for parents on key issues such as the use of technology in the home, parental controls, screen time, emerging technologies, respectful online communication, cyberbullying, sexting and image sharing and how to engage positively in their children's online lives. Through videos, experts offer advice on everything from talking to your child about sexting to modelling good behaviour. Information on where to get additional help and support in dealing with illegal material or harmful use of the internet is also readily available on the Hub.

Internet Safety Talks for Parents

In the area of parental collaboration, there are free, scripted Internet Safety Talk for Parents presentations that can be used by primary schools who may wish to host parent internet safety evenings and promote collaboration with parents regarding online safety for children and young people. Online Safety Tips for Parents



HAVE THE CHAT

Have regular conversations with your child on the important things to look out for online and potential dangers.



AGREE RULES

Agree on a clear set of rules in your home about internet use and around screentime. Remember the importance of a healthy balance!



ASKING FOR HELP

Reassure your child that they should always come talk to you if something happens online.



TAKE A CLOSER LOOK

Not all information online is correct. Encourage your child to critically evaluate information they come across online.



LEAD BY EXAMPLE

Do as you say! Modelling behaviour is the most powerful way you can influence your child's behaviour!



JOIN IN!

The internet is a great resource for children! Play your child's favourite computer game and discover the online world together.

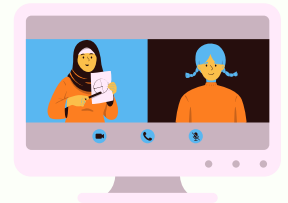

Supports for Primary Schools

Developing Robust Policy

All schools are expected to have an Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) in place that sets rights, privileges, responsibilities and sanctions associated with the use of the internet for school purposes including the use of smart phones and personal devices. The Policy is drawn up by school leaders, teachers and management and generally in consultation with parents and students. This process of consultation is consistent with the principles of the Education (Student and Parent Charter) Bill. Supports for schools on how to draft, develop and review this policy are available on webwise.ie. The need to consult with parents and students will be underpinned in law once the Education (Student and Parent Charter) Bill is enacted.

Online Courses for Educators

Understanding, Preventing and Responding to Cyberbullying

This new online cyberbullying course helps to inform teachers and school leaders about cyberbullying and a school's role in relation to creating an anti-cyberbullying culture and promoting student wellbeing including online wellbeing. Topics explored include; legal framework (Coco's Law and other relevant legislation, engaging parents, addressing incidents, prevention and awareness, etc.)

An Introduction to Digital Citizenship Education (Primary – Summer Course)

This new and engaging online course will help teachers to understand digital citizenship and how to teach and model digital citizenship in the classroom. Topics explored include online wellbeing, news and information literacy, privacy, communication, ethics, empathy and more.

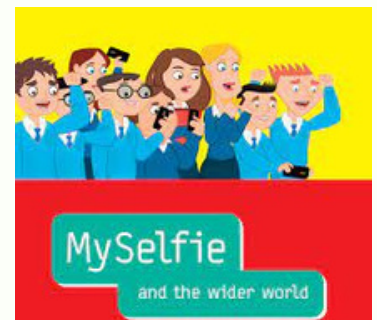
HTML HEROES (1ST - 4TH CLASS)

ALL ABOARD FOR DIGITOWN

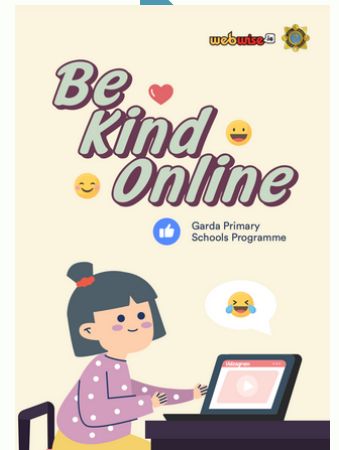
A learning path for 9 -12 year olds to become smart digital citizens. Help pupils explore the concept of digital citizenship across 10 themes in the DigiTown activity book.
